# SALC6 and new governing board of SALC:

This year was the year of the 6th Conference of the Scandinavian Association for Language and Cognition (SALC6) which took place at Lund University, Sweden, on April 20-22. SALC6 offered thought-provoking plenary presentations by Raymond Gibbs, Ivana Bianchi, Joanna Rączaszek-Leonardi, Mark Dingemanse, Iraide Ibarretxe-Antuñano & Rosario Caballero, and Dirk Geeraerts, and interesting presentations and discussions on many different themes (i.e. motion semantics, atypical language-cognition, syntax and cognition, multimodality and signed languages, multimodality and metaphor, multimodality and sound symbolism, metaphor, metaphor and (un)consciousness, analogy, cross-cultural communication, lexicon and grammar, psycholinguistics, opposites, cognitive typology, constructions, aspect and verbs, language learning, and language and culture). The conference also hosted our SALC business meeting, in which the new governing board of SALC was nominated (for the period of 22 April, 2017 – SALC 7, 2019). # SALC meeting with ICLC and other affiliate organizations:

This year was also the year of the <u>fourteenth International Cognitive Linguistics Conference</u> (ICLC - 14) 10-14 July, in Tartu, Estonia. During the conference a meeting was held for all affiliate organizations of ICLA. The meeting was led by ICLA president Maarten Lemmens and representatives from various affiliate organizations were present. SALC was represented by Tore Nesset who also represented NORKOG, and SCLA, and here is some information from the meeting. The question discussed was how to improve the collaboration among the affiliate organizations and between the affiliate organizations and ICLA. A number of suggestions have been considered in the past (e.g. automatic membership of ICLA if you are member of an affiliate organization), but most of the proposals have been found impracticable.

Areas of possible cooperation that were discussed at the meeting include summer schools and conferences for junior scholars. No general agreement was reached.

The most concrete point that came out of the meeting was a strong encouragement to share information through ICLA's webpage. Affiliate organizations have the opportunity to post information about their events on the web page, and there is also a blog function which affiliate organizations are welcome to use. Naturally, it was wished that information about ICLA would mutually be shared on the affiliate organizations' webpages.
