Henrik Bergqvist, University of Stockholm: Drawing the boundaries of evidentiality: eventtypes and participant-roles

Friday, March 27, 2015 14:00-16:00 at University of Copenhagen (KUA) room 27.0.47

This talk analyses evidentials from a Jakobsonian perspective by discussing the notion of event-type, but also considers the intersection between evidentiality and related forms of epistemic marking akin to well-known

categories such as 'person' and 'speech-act'. The discussion will draw on first-hand data from Andean languages (Kogi, Ika) and a cross-linguistic comparison of data from the literature.

The language of the workshop is English, and the workshop will be attended by one of the plenary speakers of the conference, Professor Dirk Geeraerts (University of Leuven, Belgium).
